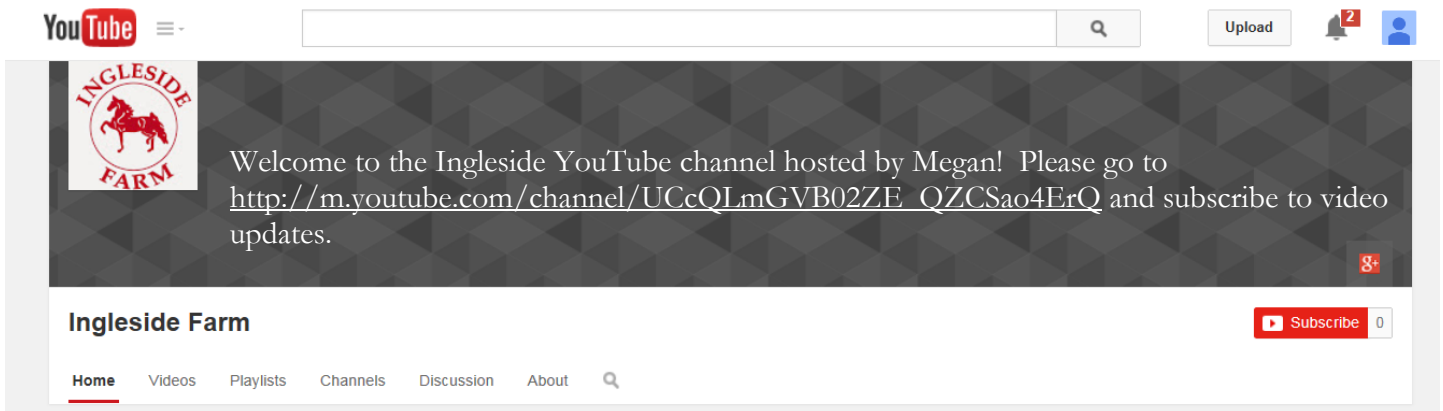
On 07 December join us in Durham for the first winter tournament of the season. Bring your Ingleside attire and cheer on those in the academy program.



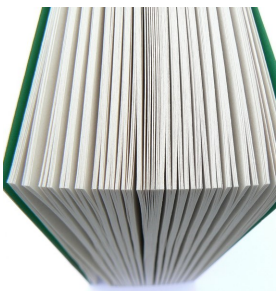

From the Rule Book



Rule Books guide judges to selections

Many of you know that Heather judges horse shows around the US. She recently returned from judging at the Academy Nationals in Tennessee. As a judge there is an entire rule book to guide judges in their selections. Most of us have never read the Rule Book, although it is a good idea to read the sections relevant to the division in which you show. Therefore, Heather has selected the below to highlight what equitation is really about!

Saddle Seat Equitation EQ115 Position

1. GENERAL. Judges should note that the required Equitation Seat should in no way be exaggerated but be thoroughly efficient and most comfortable for riding the type of horse called for at any gait and for any length of time. In Saddle Seat Equitation classes, riders should convey the impression of effective and easy control. To show a horse well, he should show himself to the best advantage. Ring generalship must be taken into consideration by the judges. A complete picture of the whole is of major importance. An exhibitor is entitled to request only one time-out per class. A judge must order from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, other exhibitors, or their entries.
